We are so grateful to the numerous adopters who have welcomed new pets into their homes while stuck in social distancing limbo! This outpouring of available homes, combined with current domestic travel restrictions have curtailed pet transports from our shelter/rescue partners across the U.S..

That means that at this time, there are fewer pets available for adoption than usual. This also means that there are lots of wonderful potential adopters searching for a new family member, and pets are hard to come by (trust us we've been doing this a long time)!



ON STAYING AFLOAT FINANCIALLY DURING A PANDEMIC....

Many people are shocked to hear that our shelter and clinic are NOT financially supported by the city/state or government, and that we run 100% of the shelter and clinic through our adoption / surrender / clinic fees, and any donations or grants we are lucky enough to receive.

It's a LOT of work applying for a small number of grants open to animal shelters – and there are a LOT of shelters that we have to compete against, so sadly grants aren't anything to rely on.




